Questions:

Kelly: What are the rules behind having CRC – VSS? Some volunteers are not directly supervising kids – as they have a teacher always with them. Some activities do not include the responsibility for children, such as escorting the students to and from Lanark Community Care for Hallowe'en Parade.

Stacie: In theory yes you are correct, but it is to cover our bases and to know who is in the school, and it's a matter of abundance of caution. Some volunteers could be reading with kids. *Board Policy: The Upper Canada District School Board will not allow school access to Service Providers or Volunteers who have direct and regular contact with students: who have not provided a Criminal Background Check and Vulnerable Sector Screening*,

Emily: Are there any donations needed for snow related toys? On the School grounds?

Stacie: Toboggans, were treated well. Lots of sleds and shovels remain. We tried juice jugs, but they were not good for snow as they were brittle in the cold, they are good for sand. Maybe snow makers are they are made of heavy plastic, but the kids are happy with what they have and worked well with an assembly line today.

Parking for concerts, is this snow dependent? Will it be behind the gym? Dec 20^{th,} 2023

Stacie: It will be in the back again, but not for the Kinder Concert. There will be NO PARKING on side of bus lane, parking on pavement only, back half closer to Wilson St. This is good for grandparents as it is closer than the accessibility spots as they can go straight into the gym.
